
Only two days after moving into her KU freshman dorm, Jessica Fosburg learned that her mother, Patti Powell, was diagnosed with stage 4 lung cancer. She has incurable cancer with no resources, can't work, has no money, and no private insurance. In spite of all the heartbreak and having zero financial assistance from her newly sick mother, Jessica found a way to stay in school, drive home every weekend to help, and still made the Dean's List. To help with the family's financial struggles, Patti's sister and brother-in-law have entered a contest sponsored by Lenovo, in which employees can submit a video using the company's products in order to win a \$50,000 grand prize – if the contestant gets 500,000 views on YouTube by January 31. Allan Bäck, professor of philosophy, has published his translation of Avicenna's commentary on Aristotle's *De Interpretatione* (On Interpretation). The translation of the text, which introduces Avicenna's thoughts and theories on the topics discussed by Aristotle, is the first in a Western language. In the introduction of the book, Bäck notes that "we must make a start sometime in bringing into wider circulation more of the work of Avicenna, the preeminent Islamic philosopher." Bäck has written articles and books on a variety of topics in the history and philosophy of logic, including ancient and Islamic philosophy. He has also been awarded several honors for his work, including the Forschungspreis from the Alexander von Humboldt Stiftung (Senior Humboldt Research Prize), an American Philosophical Association Fellowship for the Institute for Advanced Studies at Edinburgh University in recognition of his scholarly work, the Wiesenberger award for teaching and the Chambliss prize for research at KU. 


