A record number of KU student-athletes came out in support of the KU Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC)'s third annual Main Street Clean Up. An estimated 225 student-athletes participated and walked down Kutztown's Main Street the morning after KU's annual homecoming celebration. Student-athletes started at KU's Stratton Building and walked up and down Main Street (including nearby crossroads) with their gloves and trash bags in hand, all for the common goal of giving back to the community. 2015 marks the third year SAAC has led the charge to clean up Main Street, and the effort has grown every year.



KU HISTORY

Nov. 8, 1960: John F. Kennedy was elected President of the United States. In a mock election at Kutztown State College, Richard Nixon was the winner 464-288. The leaders of the campus Republicans were certain Nixon would be triumphant in the national election; so certain, in fact, that they promised to push peanuts down Kutztown Road with their noses if Kennedy won. They made good on their promise.

The Kutztown University Council of Trustees voted unanimously to award an honorary doctor of laws degree to **Guido Pichini '74**. Guido was elected to a fifth consecutive term as chairman of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (PASSHE) Board of Governors in July. Four years ago, he became the first State System university alumnus to chair the board that oversees PASSHE.

Guido is president of WSK & Associates and its related companies of Wyomissing. He is a member and former chair of the Council of Trustees at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania and the former chair of the Pennsylvania Association of Councils of Trustees, the statewide organization that comprises the trustees from all 14 PASSHE schools. Guido will be presented with the honorary doctorate at Kutztown University's Presidential Inauguration on April 15, 2016.

At Homecoming, KU Alumni Board President Kathy Fridirici '77, '87 picked the winning raffle ticket for a free weekend at the O'Callahan Hotel in Historical Annapolis, MD. All proceeds from the raffle went to the Lambda Chi Alpha Scholarship Fund.

The Robert McMullen Memorial Scholarship for Lambda Chi Alpha started in 2005 to recognize and award students who excel academically, as a brother in the chapter, and in their community. <<< Financial need is also considered when selecting the winners.

Kutztown University's Small Business Development Center (SBDC) took top honors from the Community First Fund at the Lancaster County Convention Center. The SBDC received the James Hyson Advocate Award for its work as a community partner that provides loan referral and business support services for Community First Fund clients. The SBDC shared a video highlighting the story of a client, Super Natural and Fresh Produce, in which the Center worked with Community First Fund to get the store a loan and provided support and training, thus bridging the gap for small and startup businesses.
