Dr. Todd Underwood, professor of biology, was recently awarded a Chambliss Faculty Research Award. Dr. Underwood has exhibited an extraordinary commitment to research in ornithology, establishing an impressive record of publication and professional presentations in his discipline. Underwood recently received national recognition through his selection as an elective member by the American Ornithologists' Union (AOU), the premiere professional society for avian biologists.

Kutztown University's Entrepreneurial Leadership Center (ELC) hosted the final round of judging for the 4th Annual Business Idea Competition on Thursday, Nov. 20. Entries were judged in the preliminary round and four finalist teams were selected. These teams presented their business ideas to a panel of local judges. Matt Minich, from the College

Each Saturday at 8:00 pm, a different college lecture is featured as part of the channel's "Lectures in History" series. 
