Campus News

We are pleased to announce that the 12th president of Kutztown University will be introduced to the campus community on Tuesday, March 17, at 4 p.m. in MSU 218 (Multipurpose Room). Brief remarks by the new president and other dignitaries will begin at 4 p.m., followed by a reception until 6 p.m. Refreshments will be served and entertainment provided by KU student musicians. Students, faculty and staff are encouraged to attend this momentous occasion. The name of the successful candidate will be announced to campus via KU email immediately following a vote by the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education Board of Governors in Harrisburg earlier that afternoon.

The Kutztown University Department of Music will present a free concert of choral music featuring the University Choir, Chamber Singers, Bear Voices, and After Hours Vocal jazz Ensemble Saturday night, March 28, 7:30pm in Schaeffer Auditorium. *Of Wind and Water* will include music from classical pieces by Palestrina (*By the Waters of Babylon*), Monteverdi (*Hear the Murmuring Waters*), and Mendelssohn (*On the Lake*) to popular pieces *Candle on the Water* (from *Pete's Dragon*), *Colors of the Wind* (from *Pocahontas*), and *Walk on the Water* (from *Soul Surfer*), to jazz arrangements of *Summer Wind* and *Beyond the Sea* to traditional choral music, spirituals and folks songs, all on the subject of wind or water.

KU played host to more than 500 middle and high school students competing in the Central Eastern PA Regional Science Olympiad on March 10. Twenty-eight Division C high schools and 13 Division B middle schools entered teams to compete in 23 different events. The top four middle school and top six high school teams will advance to the state competition at Juniata College on April 25. The national tournament is held May 15-16 at the University of Nebraska, Lincoln.

The Military Club of KU will host the 2015 Keystone Wounded Warrior 5K Run/1-Mile Walk on Saturday, April 4. We anticipate a great community turnout again this year! 


