DR. KENNETH HAWKINSON NAMED 12TH PRESIDENT AT KU



On Tuesday, March 17, Dr. Kenneth S. Hawkinson was named the 12th president of Kutztown University. He is the current provost at Western Illinois University, and he will assume his new position at KU on July 1. Please join us in welcoming him to our campus and community!

Dr. Kunal K. Das, professor of physics at Kutztown University, will be delivering the 4th annual *George J. Losoncy Lecture in Physics and Astronomy*, at Penn State Berks, Thursday, March 19 at 5 PM in the Perkins Student Center Auditorium. His talk is titled “*The Quantum Rules: The Laws Of Physics Applied To Everyday Life*”. The lecture will illustrate that the fundamental laws of physics can be used to explain much about our lives, spanning almost every aspect of the human experience. This event is free and open to the public, and it will be preceded by a reception in first floor Perkins Student Center lobby at 4:30 p.m., where light refreshments will be served. Kutztown University is excited to offer its first doctoral program ever, beginning this fall! The [doctorate program](#), “Social Work in Leadership and Education,” will be one of only two doctorates in social work offered in Pennsylvania once approved by the Middle State Commission on Higher Education. The program is being designed for professional social workers who are ready to take on advanced leadership positions, enabling them to obtain executive and academic posts. The program will take three years to complete, and course work will be completed online and through intensive weekend classes.

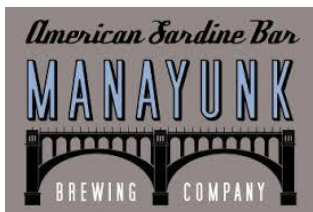
Golden Bear Athletics
