**KU's Career Development Center (CDC) will host Criminal Justice Career Development Day** from 10 AM to 4 PM on Wednesday, March 25 in the McFarland Student Union (MSU) building. Keynote speaker Dr. Al Pisciotta will begin the day with a talk in MSU room 218, and then attendees will break into panels. The panels will focus on federal law enforcement; court administrators, prosecutors, and public defenders; local and city police; private and non-profit agencies; corrections; state police; security and asset protection; and graduate and law school. ## GOLDEN BEAR ATHLETICS

**Women's Basketball:** Senior Advia Campbell surpassed a career milestone on Saturday afternoon, leading the fourth-seeded Kutztown University women's basketball team past fifth-seeded Lock Haven University in the First Round of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) playoffs from Keystone Arena, 74-52. With 12:22 remaining in the second half, Campbell converted two-straight free throws to reach 1,000 points for her career, becoming the 14th Golden Bear to do so in program history. She notched her third-consecutive double-double and eighth of the season, scoring a career-high-tying 21 points and bringing down a game-high 15 rebounds. Campbell was perfect from the charity stripe (7-of-7), while recording three blocks, two assists, and a steal in 37 minutes of action. [Read the story here.](#)

**Wrestling:** The KU wrestling team wrapped up a tremendous weekend at the NCAA Division II Super Region I Championships on Saturday. The Golden Bears concluded the two-day tournament at West Liberty University with one regional champion, four national qualifiers, and place winners in eight of the ten weight classes. Kutztown finished in third place with 92.5 points, matching a program-best under head coach Robert Fisher. [Read the story here.](#)

**Men's Basketball:** Tynell Fortune and Josh Johnson combined for 44 points to lead the Kutztown University men's basketball team to its first playoff victory in five years with a 77-54 victory over Shippensburg University on Saturday afternoon at Keystone Arena in the first round of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Tournament. It marked Kutztown's largest margin of victory in a PSAC Tournament game in program history. [Read the story here.](#)

**Women's Bowling:** The KU women's bowling team finished exactly where it needed to on Sunday. The top-six teams in the final Northeast Conference (NEC) standings qualify for the conference championships later this month, and Kutztown will be one of those teams with a sixth place finish on Sunday after the third and final NEC regular season meet at Holiday Bowl in Altoona, PA. The Golden Bears (55-47, 9-12 NEC) entered the day in sixth place, and finished the day tied for sixth with Adelphi University. KU won the tiebreaker with a 2-1 head-to-head advantage over Adelphi this year, moving it into sole possession of sixth place and the final team into the NEC Championships on March 20-22 at Howell Lanes in Howell, N.J.

**Women's Track & Field:** The Kutztown University women's track & field team wrapped up the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Indoor Championships at Edinboro University on Sunday afternoon in 10th place of 16 competing teams, matching its indoor finish from last season. Over the two-day championship, 11 Golden Bears contributed to 28 team points. Pole vaulter Emma Sullivan led the way with six on Saturday; vaulter Destiny Distasio and distance runner Corinne Manela each tallied five points, and sprinter Valerie Mizansky rounded out the top-four for KU with four points.




**Men's Track & Field:** The Kutztown University men's track & field team wrapped up the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Indoor Championships at Edinboro University on Sunday afternoon in seventh place of 13 competing teams, an improvement by three spots from last year's indoor championships. Over the two-day championship, 14 Golden Bears contributed to 40 team points. Tyler Brooks and Kutztown's 4x400 team led the way with six points each, vaulter Lanny Buck and KU's 4x800 team each brought in five team points, as thrower Chris Varichione and KU's DMR team from Saturday rounded out KU's top performers with four team points apiece.
