KU HISTORY



September 1985, computers were used for the first time for drop/add at KU. Each department had one computer and one individual trained to perform drop/add functions. Departments could only access their classes, so a student had to go to one department to drop a class and then to another department to add a class.

Kutztown University rededicated three recently renovated residence halls at a ceremony at Tri-County Halls on South Campus. Dr. Kenneth S. Hawkinson, president, officiated at the rededication of Berks, Lehigh and Schuylkill residence halls. The dorms were opened in 1964 and were named after the three counties for which the college originally served when it opened as Kutztown Normal School in 1866. KU invested roughly \$23.7 million in renovations and updates to the dorms, which house about 200 students each. >>>
