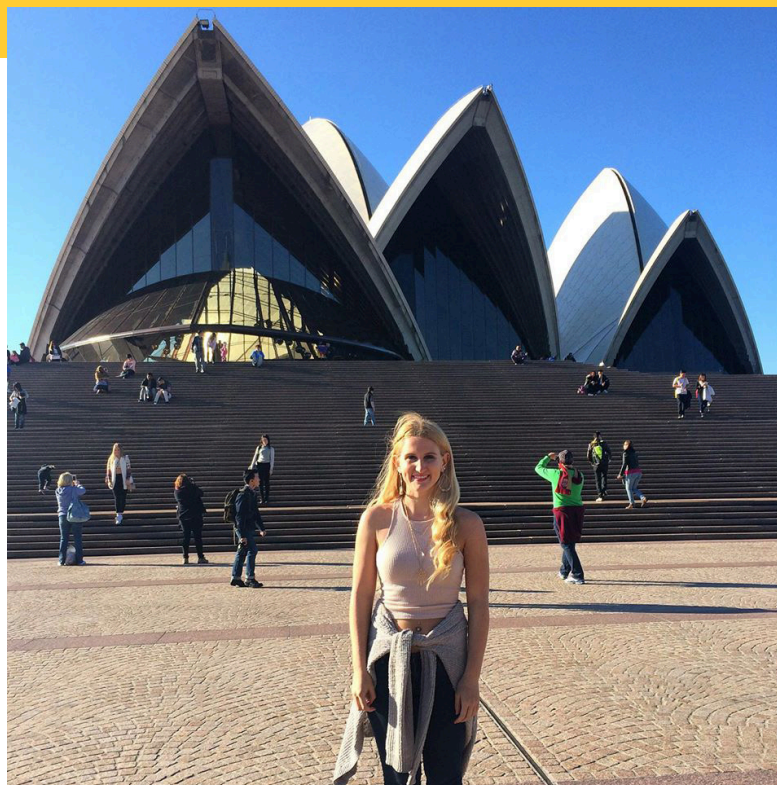


The KU Geology Club traveled to Puerto Rico with Dr. Kurt Frieauf in May to explore tropically-eroded ancient volcanic rocks, cave networks in the limestone cap rocks, variations in beach sediments along the northern coast, bioluminescent dinoflagellates in marine lagoons, the giant Arecibo radio telescope, and Latin-Caribbean culture. They learned much more than mere geology from their travels. Facts can be googled, but experience is woven into our souls.
